
'Some fine yew trees' were described here in 1880 in a TH Thomas paper presented to the Cardiff Naturalists Society.

The Rev J.Daryll Evans in *Yew Trees of Gwent* recorded a yew with a girth of 588 cm (19' 3") at 1m in 1988. He also noted 'a big yew stump near entrance gate'.

In 1999 the only yew of note was this female growing north of the church, almost touching the churchyard boundary wall. It leans slightly towards the road. At 6' its bole divides into two growth areas supporting many branches. Foliage was sparse, with much gall and many discoloured leaves. A piece of stump about 5' high (A) is separated from the tree.

Girth at the ground including the stump was 20' 1" and without the stump 18' 6". Girth at 3' including stump was 20' 8" and without stump 18' 4".
