




1849: 'In the churchyard is a yew-tree of remarkably fine growth'. *A Topographical Dictionary of Wales*

1875: The drawing, showing the yew, can be seen in *The River Dee, its aspect and history* by J.S.Howson.

2007: There are six yews ringing this churchyard and this is the one documented in 1849, growing close to the church on its south side. Much of its bole was hidden behind upright twiggy growth and a girth of approximately 19' at 4' was recorded.



The church was for sale. I was informed locally that no offers had been made to buy the property because of the number of restrictions on the use of both building and churchyard.
