

Cornish (1946) had been informed by Canon E.H.Goddard that yews here were 'old and numerous'.

I visited in 2000 to find a church declared redundant in 1975 and cared for by the Churches Conservation Trust. Since all the trees here were small girthed I took no records.

In 2009 Peter Norton recorded seven yews within the churchyard, with the most significant growing west of the north churchyard entrance. There was well established internal growth and evidence of the rotting and decayed outer trunk. Its small girth did not take into account the missing decayed trunk.



Also recorded were two of the younger yews, one growing west of the church with a girth of 11' 6" at 2' 6" and another, east of the churchyard entrance, with a girth of 8' 6" at 2' 6".
