

While no old written record has been found, the Nonington yew appears in both the ink drawing created in about 1800 and the sepia print of Saunders dated 1867. (Kentarchaeology.org.uk )



July 2002: A female yew, SE of the church, with many thick branches supporting vigorous growth. Its elongated bole, with a girth of 17'1", presents two very large faces. The tree has been larger girthed, and a missing portion of the original trunk reveals internal growth seen below.
