2001 and 2014: This fine female yew with thick foliage had a girth of 13' 5" at 3' in 2001 and 14' 2" at 3' in 2014, an increase of 9" in 13 years. It grows west of the tower on a circular mound of great regularity.

Holy Trinity





The yew's hollow centre has been filled with concrete. From its trunk rises a main stem, in which a split is visible. Another large stem has been cut off from the NE face of the tree. Concrete partially covers this point. Apart from the rising main stem all growth is recent.

In 2014 a second yew was recorded. It grows even further west and is presumably a millennium yew. It is not bushy and is about 10' tall. A stake gave it some support. Girth was 1' 11/2" at 6".
