



2010 Cliff Hansford: The yew has a girth of 12' at 3' from the ground, increasing to 15' at a height of 5'. The bole of the yew looks very much the worse for wear as a result of some earlier work either to save the yew or, perhaps, prevent it from being vandalised (set on fire).

Originally there were five limbs projecting from the one bole from a height of 6 ft. Two of the limbs (S/W aspect) have been removed. A number of canopy branches have been seen back. Canopy foliage looks sparse. I understand that bats are currently in residence (though I could not see where).

All hollow areas that are visible from the ground are filled with concrete and some areas have a rubble in-fill.



There are a total of twelve yews located in the east and south of the churchyard. They are not as large as the one above and look to be in reasonably good health.
