Visited in 2005, 2011 and 2020: Two yews grow here, probably of the same age, one to the north and one south of the church.

The female to the south was recorded as follows:

2005: 17' 1" at the ground

2011: 17' 5" between the ground and 6". 2020: 17' 7" between the ground and 6".

This large girth is retained for a height of about 10' before many branches develop. One hole at he ground reveals it to be hollow. Many of its lower branches have been systematically removed and the bole is consequently very knobbly. All photographs were taken in 2011.











The male grows on the north side on rising ground. At 4'/6' it bulges, caused by branch removal. It has a tall, straight leading branch and a fine healthy crown. Holes show that it is becoming hollow.

Girth's recorded as follows:

2005:16' 4" at 3' above the path 2011:16' 6"at 3' above the path 2020: 17' 0" at 3' above the path
