2003: Twenty one yews grow on three sides of the churchyard perimeter, but unusually there are none to the south. The significant tree grows NW of the church, the first tree to the right on entering the churchyard. It had a girth of 13' 11" at the ground. Much of its first two feet of growth is fluted, above which is considerable swelling, caused by the cutting back of low branches. Foliage was very thick on a tree in good health. This yew is considered to have a Known Planting Date of 1509, but I have not been able to establish the source of this information.
