

2009: The yew grows south of the church and is set inside a 2' high wall with generous space to allow for its inevitable expansion. On the church side the tree's whole trunk could be seen, but on the south side there was much bramble and elder growth which must hide that side of the tree during the summer months. It is a fine, imposing and well looked after tree, with a large girth to a height of about 20'. Vigorous branch growth supports an evenly shaped canopy. As would be expected of a yew of this size there is a large hollow space where several internal stems can be seen. Girth was 18' 2" at 2'.
