

1921: The churchyard contains the trunk of a colossal yew, possibly of pre-conquest date. *Ancient Cotswold Churches* by Alric Daubeny

1999: A male yew grows south of a church with a north porch. It measured 15' 1" at 1', around its live section and a stump. These are certainly fragments of a once much larger tree. The bole divides at 8/10' into many tall rising branches. Internal growth could be seen in the main branch.
