

The old church is 5 minutes walk south-east from the farm Trefenty, close to the remains of a motte and bailey castle, a pilgrims' lodge and a once important crossing of the Afon Cowin.

1999: The remote location, combined with a dwindling rural population, led to the gradual abandonment of the church. Here the male yew thrives in splendid isolation 5 metres south of the substantial church ruin. Its bole divides into two large branches at 8'/10' with many smaller lateral branches. Foliage, whilst not thick, was generally a healthy green. Internal growth fed from decaying material in the hollow. Girth 17' 10" at 2' 6" .



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
