Four yews grow here.




Yew 1 is male and closest to the church, south of the building's east end. It is a remnant of something that was once larger. There was too much low growth to allow measurement. 10' girth would be a reasonable estimate. It has been topped or pollarded at a height of about 5' and one thick sawn off branch testifies to the fact that this was once a substantial tree.



Yew 2 is female. It has many stems from close to the ground and spreading branches. Girth was 11' 7" close to the ground.

Yew 3 is male. It has 2 main stems from close to the ground. It was unmeasurable and perhaps 8' in girth.

Yew 4 is female, smallest of the yews here.
