2011: Here is a 13<sup>th</sup> century church, with its yew growing NE. It is puzzling that such a fine ancient specimen should have taken so long to be recognised, not coming to our attention until 2010. It is an outstanding tree with a complete circle of almost 23' of living wood, bulging to over 30' at 5' and covered in twiggy and adventitious growth. Two holes at the base indicate that the tree is hollow, while in its branches can be see the truncated remains of what would have been the original bole. Its crown has a fine expansive shape and the tree appeared in very good health. It is male with a girth of 22' 8" at between 1' and 1' 6" - above the root bulging. A girth of 9m 80 at 150 cm was recorded in 2010 by Tony Bradford.
