
June 2014: 4 yews grow in the churchyard, all on the south side of the church.

The most significant yew (tree 1) has been topped and lopped. It is now a hollow shell growing close to stocks that have been sunk into concrete. A large section of the original trunk appears to have split off at some time, and it was perhaps as a result of this it was considered necessary to cut back the tree so drastically. It appeared to be recovering well. Girth was 8' 4" at 1' and 9' 6" at 4'





Tree 2 is a nondescript yew with a girth of about 6'.

Tree 3 is a young yew with girth of about 2' 9".

Tree 4 is a female millennium yew with four stems that develop from its short bole. It was filled with unripe arils
