The tower is all that remains of the church. A yew hedge has been planted along the west side of the churchyard.

2006: The female yew grows SE of the tower, at the top of a steep bank down into an adjacent garden. On the side facing the garden it is possible to see that the yew is becoming hollow. The prominent branch breaking away from the bole reveals some internal growth. It has come to rest on the wall and reaches the ground beyond, so it can lean no further. Girth was about 17' 4" at about 1'.
