



The male yew, which grows east of the church, is seen (left) in 1998. It has split into 3 sections with wires stretched around some of its branches to help prevent further separation. Some of these no longer serve a useful purpose and could be removed. Nails hammered into the lower bole appear to have once secured a barrier preventing access to the large space. Girth in 1998 was about 21' at 1'.

In 2015 Peter Norton recorded a girth of 21' 9" at about 1'.
