

A 12th century church with an imposing NW tower and Kinnersley Castle for a neighbour. The yew grows on the south side of the church.

2015: Years of churchyard waste has built up beneath this tree, especially on its north side. Girth at 1' above raised ground level might only be 14', but this yew is considerably older than girth alone suggests. We might never know where the original line of this tree was, but the loss of one side has opened up a view of some of the internal stems of the old yew. There is also a considerable amount of heartwood still in situ.
