

Feb 2016: The church was built in around 1130. Two yews grow in this churchyard, the most significant about 10 metres south of the south porch. Because of its proximity to the building its branches have been regularly trimmed. It has a short bole of just under four feet which was covered in twiggy growth almost to ground level. The centre of the tree is rotting away and perhaps in years to come it will be much altered, so that it appears as two smaller trees growing close to each other. A small patch of colourless leaves is seen in the final photograph. This is a rare phenomenon that has also been observed at Much Marcle, South Hayling and Defynnog. Girth was 16' 2" (4.92m) at 1'.
