
2003 - Tim Hills: A male yew grows ENE of the church by the entrance gate, its girth 16' 11", measured at the top of the wall. Foliage at that time was sparse.


2012 - Tim Hills: The photos below show that foliage was now thick and healthy. Ivy however was rampant and filling the tree with unnecessary extra weight. The yew is beginning to push the perimeter wall outwards. Girth of 17' 0" at the ground was over so much ivy that it can only be a guide. It was suggested that the ivy needed to be brought under control.

2015 - Paul Wood: The ivy had been removed and a girth of 16' 10" recorded, measured level with the top of the bank by the wall and under the bulge on the church side.





A second yew, also male, is a particularly tall tree growing on the southern perimeter. The middle photo shows it filled with ivy in 2012, when a girth of 17' 11" at 1' was recorded. Since the tree is on sloping ground this was 4' up on the bole where the ground slopes away. In 2015, following the removal of ivy, Paul Wood measured at 1' above the ground and recorded a girth of 18' 8".







There are reported to be old yews on the track leading away from Munslow towards Wenlock Edge.
