2000: The male yew grows SW of the Norman church. The bole was covered in ivy and bushy growth, with twigginess close to the ground exaggerating its 17' girth.

A main branch rises from the centre, with many smaller branches emerging all around the tree.

In *The Sussex Tree book* (1998) Owen Johnson described it as 'branchy from base' with a diameter of 188 cm at 0.1m. and a height of 11m. We have no date for this measurement.

2012: Peter Norton recorded a male tree with a 4' 6" bole and 3 leaders. Much ivy in the crown and a large amount of low twiggy growth. Tape very carefully threaded behind the low growth and at 2' a girth of 17' was recorded. The photos were taken at the time of his visit.
