

*The Celtic Christian Sites of the central and southern Marches* (2006) by Sarah and John Zaluckyj described "an old yew in the north west corner which is showing the beginnings of hollowing and thus appears to be of some age."

2017 - The ancient yew grows NW of the church. It leans and was difficult to measure, but two girths were recorded. At the ground on one side and above the most bulging roots on the other a girth of 17' 9" was recorded. Using a nail that somebody has hammered in at a height of about 8" produced a girth of 18' 7". The tree is hollow on the west side.
