

Mee (1938) noted a "fine old yew near the porch".

This was presumably the male yew seen in the foreground, growing SE of the church. It is a robust and hollow tree with much upright and angled growth, measuring 14' 9" at 5'.



Closer to the church is a female yew with a girth of 11' 1" at 2' - just beneath the bulge of twiggy growth. Its main riser eventually divides into two with much branching.
