A small, narrow, isolated dale site



The churchyard is demarked by stone walls west and north, a wall and Hodge Beck to the east and what clearly was a row of yews to the south from the gate. Some yews have been removed and replaced by large evergreens on the south and easterly boundaries. Six of the many yews in this churchyard are numbered here.



Yew 1 was not measured. Yew 2, below, is the largest in the churchyard. It has had had many of its branches removed. Girth at 1m from the ground was 4.9m.







Yew 3, below left, appeared to be the largest growing east of the church. Its girth was 3.4m at 1m from the ground. Yew 4, centre, could not be measured and yew 5, right, is competing with another tree. This is often seen in woodlands, but is rare in churchyards.
