
August 2016: Here is a previously undocumented ancient female yew. It grows NW of the church, only 2 metres from the building and 50 cm from the wall of an adjacent garden. On the side facing the wall is a large hollow space. The tree had a girth of exactly 16', keeping the tape close to the ground but riding above bulging roots. Large quantities of ivy were taking hold and the area around the tree was being used to store bits of old corrugated iron. The remains of Laetiporus sulphurous, the Chicken-of-the-Woods bracket fungus, could be seen.
