2009: A female yew growing SW of the church forms part of the boundary with the rectory garden. The positioning of wire netting suggested that the tree was now considered to belong to the garden.





On the side facing the garden the tree had been trimmed so that it looked more like a piece of hedge, completely hiding the bole. From what I could see, this consisted of at least seven thick branches rising parallel to each other. I thought girth would be between 14' and 16'.

In 2015 Paul Wood recorded that twiggy growth had been removed and that a splendid bole was now quite visible. There was no rotting or hollows and the tree looked in fine condition. He recorded a girth of 16' 7" (5.05m) at the ground level on the hedge side of the tree.
