

In Cornish's 1946 *The Churchyard Yew and Immortality*, a yew here is described as 'picturesque'.

2004: The yew is male and grows SW of the church. It appears solid, but gaps on its east side close to the road reveal large hollow spaces within. Its large girth is retained for about 20', at which point the tree appears to have been truncated.

Girth was 18' 3" at the ground, allowing tape to rise over roots.
